We welcome Just Some Theatre back to the county with their latest comedy drama 'The Plot Thickens', learn more about Blackburn's songbird Kathleen Ferrier and finish the season with a round of toasted crumpets with 'Barbara' - a heartwarming show which gently touches on the role of caring for loved ones as they get older.

If you want something to keep the family busy over the school holidays we have The Blahs bringing The Hidden Garden, their children's show inspired by audiences in Lancashire, to three venues. We're inviting Stories in The Dust, an eco-fable about caring for our planet, to deliver workshops and shows in eight locations! As usual, we'll be planting a tree for every show we host

to show our commitment to protecting the environment we live in.

We've been working with the Mechanics in their 'Front Room' space with a group of community promoters to host Jazz, folk music and new theatre, and we're now taking that ethos and working in community-run spaces across Burnley.


From children's theatre shows to specialist art workshops for adults, we are asking the people of Burnley what they want to see in their venue and then making it happen (just like we do with Spot On). WHAT DO WE WANT TO ACHIEVE?


The Aims of Lancashire County of Song:

- To showcase the quality of Lancashire's rich and diverse singing traditions.
- To highlight the benefits of singing specifically for health, and more broadly for social connection and pride in place.
- To promote singing as an "easy access" activity, with groups available for all kinds of people.
- To raise awareness of local vocal opportunities right across the county in every district.
- To leave Lancashire's grassroots singing scene stronger and better connected after 2024.

This year, County of Song has had a particular focus on the benefits of singing for people affected by dementia. This has included supporting research with local groups on the power of singing for both people with dementia, and promoting an intergenerational concert in Blackburn.

As County of Song Community Champion Ryan Dixon puts it:

"...sessions aim to provide the participants with an immersive musical experience within a down to earth, friendly and inclusive group. They are encouraged and invited to sing, regardless of whether or not they have a previous musical background, and this most often creates a fun, joyful environment where people can really express themselves. In addition to the musical benefits, these sessions give participants a sense of community - a place to meet like-minded people and socialise."
